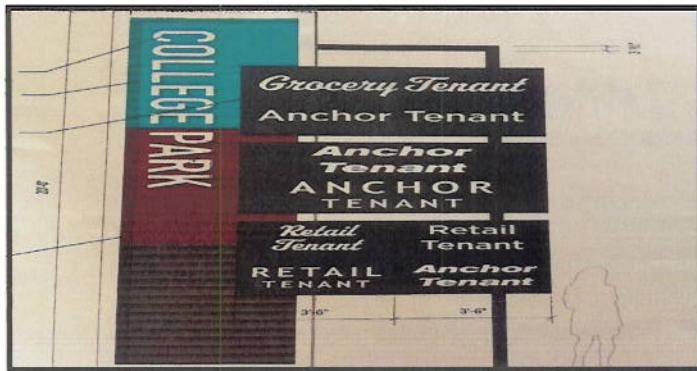

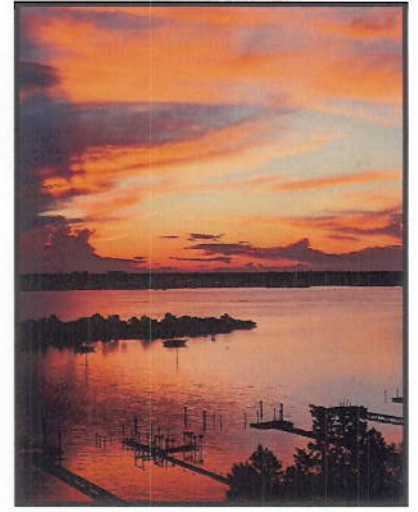
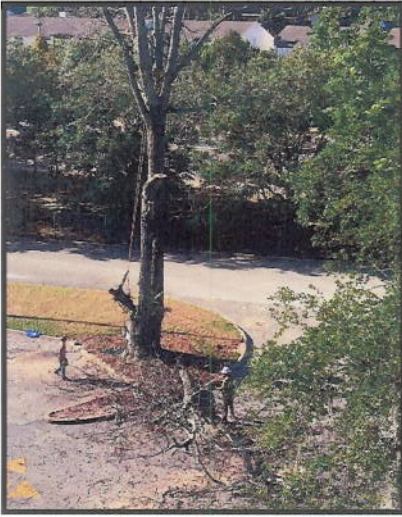
This newsletter's photographer Deedy Creed accompanied me.

Doctor on Demand by Leisla Sansom

I recently needed a medication prescription on a Saturday evening. I was dreading calling my Primary Care Doctor on Monday - anticipating an answer of "Please leave a message - and we'll call you if we get around to it later. Maybe."

Instead, I used **Doctor On Demand** (doctorondemand.com), which is available 24/7. Registration requires a computer with a camera and Google Chrome or Firefox OR a smartphone or tablet and a free Doctor On Demand app (available on the App Store or Google Play). After registration, I was asked to enter my name, birthday, email address, pharmacy, and information about medical problems and medications.

The web site was easy to use and the reviewing physician was focused, helpful, and professional. He sent the requested prescription to Walgreens and I had it filled on Sunday morning. And yes, I would definitely use this service again.
